

- Currently working on refurbishments in Alcuin blocks N, P and Q and Derwent blocks E and F




New Campus East residences

Closure notice: Central Hall will be closed for 16 weeks from 28 January 2019. This is to allow the next phase of the refurbishment works to be carried out. There will be no access to Central Hall during this time but routes around the outside of the hall should be unaffected.

Location

Campus West

As the landmark building at the heart of the University, Central Hall is undergoing a series of refurbishments to provide an up-to-date, multi-use space.

Due to major University events such as Graduation and Open Days, work will be compressed between the start of Spring Term and June over three phases.

Phase 1 (completed in 2017)

Installation of new glazing

Phase 2 (completed in June 2018)

- Upgrade of audiovisual systems
- · Upgrade of parts of the auditorium
- Overhaul of the reception area making it lighter, brighter and more welcoming

Phase 3 (commencing in January 2019)

- Replacement of seating
- · Installation of air conditioning

Central Hall refurbishment

As the landmark building at the heart of the University. Central Hall is undergoing a series of refurbishments to provide an up-to-date, multi-use space.



A large scale, phased refurbishment of the University's iconic Central Hall building Plans include:

- New windows
- · Audio Visual and IT system replacement
- · A major overhaul of the reception/ground floor area
- Electrical and mechanical works
- Fire safety works
- · Installation of a comfort cooling system
- Refurbishment of the upper floor rehearsal/dressing rooms

When?

Work began in 2017

Initial works have been phased to take place over three years to ensure that the building can re-open each year for major events such open days and graduation. This minimises the impact on our students, staff and visitors.

Why?

The work is needed to make sure that systems in the building are up to current standards, including improvements to fire safety.

The building facilities will be brought up to date to improve the offering for a wide range of users.

Central Hall 2020 works (phase 4)- Public Realm comprising accessible, external mixed use space and new entrance area

Concept Landscape Design

Concrete and timber with plank paving maintain a link with Greg's Place and a contemporary aesthetic. Line of original Central Hall steps replicated in the landscape outside through paving patterns. Colour to tone with original brickwork on the lake side.

> Concrete steps and timber seating cut into existing mound.

Amphitheatre/ performance space created.

Willow trees removed from outside Central Hall leaving space for a new generation of trees.

Jetty to allow more space for movement and circulation from the bridge.









Development Projects ASIF BUILDING (CRYO EM)





- An 'integrated imaging facility' containing other data gathering labs as well as a Cryo-EM.
- These include Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectrometer (NMR), crystallography and X-ray facilities.
- Budget £5.3 million
- Works due to start on site in April


